New horizons

What strikes you as you walk into Merry and Ben Albright's Herefordshire home is how well-organised it is. Nothing is out of place and there isn't a hint of clutter, despite the fact that they moved into newly built Black Fox Cottage just six months ago. The couple are clearly disciplined about limiting possessions to the essentials, but it is no surprise to learn that the kitchen (which shares the largest space in the house with a living and dining area) was designed when the house was still on the drawing board.

Merry's father, John Greene, is an architect whose company Border Oak produces green-oak-framed buildings inspired by vernacular styles and the Arts and Crafts movement. He designed the house and worked closely with the couple. "We decided to make the kitchen symmetrical but not be too rigid about the details and finishes," Merry says. "I felt that if the design was too uniform it would exaggerate the house's newness." The sense of balance achieved gives the room an almost Shaker 'quietness'. The contemporary layout makes for pleasing sightlines, but the variety of finishes – oiled maple or granite worksurfaces and the mixture of glazed and solid-wood doors – all have a softening effect.

Merry chose kitchen company DeVol, which produces bespoke painted wooden styles that are freestanding. The palette of cream, blue and mushroom appears delicate against the solidity of the natural materials – the green oak beams and black limestone tile floor. The result is a successful combination of traditional and modern design and a compact kitchen that is both practical and stylish. ☒
